HELP NEEDED ON NEW CHARITY PROJECTS

Peggy Kern and Steph Wagaman recently attended a Prayer Shawl Ingathering at First Presbyterian Church in Bethlehem, PA. Many prayer shawl groups from area churches and charity knitters from Knitter's Edge attended and shared their knitting and crochet projects. We met a lot of great people and received free knitting patterns from Knitter's Edge.

Currently, there is a need for **knitted or crocheted mittens** for children in our inner-cities. If you would like to help out, please see Steph or Peggy for a pattern. Also, we're planning a get-together after church on **November 15** to work on the mittens project. If you are interested, please bring crochet hook size G or H or knitting needles size 5 or 7. Additionally, we learned that there is a **great need for men's socks** for homeless or sheltered men. We would like to join the Knitter's Edge charity group in collecting new men's socks (cotton only please) which will be distributed in our community through local soup kitchens. Men's cotton socks typically sell for about \$1-\$2 a pair at Walmart and Dollar stores. We will place a box in the narthex for the socks.

Lastly, in November we will be doing our annual coat drive, and will be collecting gently-used coats for people in need. As you go through closets to prepare for colder weather, keep us in mind and bring in any extra coats that you can spare.
