Dear Members and Friends,

By the time you read this, we will have entered the season of the church year called Pentecost. Pentecost means the 50<sup>th</sup> day after Easter. Christians mark the completion of Christ's earthly mission and the sending of the Holy Spirit to oversee the birth of the Christian community. In pouring out the Spirit, Jesus kept his promise to

"send another Counselor."

The Holy Spirit was also called by Jesus "the Spirit of Truth." It showed the disciples the meaning of the Old Testament, the significance of Jesus' ministry, and baptized them with the power to carry this Truth to the people of the world. The Holy Spirit is represented in Scripture as a peaceful dove, as life-giving breath or invisible wind, or as visible fire that transforms what it touches. The Spirit is the Lord's gift to his people to give life, understanding and confidence.

The observance of Pentecost by the Christian Church begins with the Day of Pentecost. It is the climax of the 50 days of the Easter season, the birthday of the Christian Church, and the doorway into the Season of Pentecost. This season extends through summer and fall to the First Sunday of Advent.

The Holy Spirit works within us and throughout the church to extend the ministry of Christ to whom all we meet. May God's Holy Spirit continue to help us spread God's word in this community and beyond.

# Catherine Waltemyer RN June is Men's Health Month

Research shows that men are less likely to seek healthcare than women. A survey by Cleveland Clinic found 40% of men surveyed go to the doctor *only* when they have a serious health issue, and never go for routine checkups. The focus of Men's Health Month is aimed at improving the lifestyles of men. We all know that improving health includes diet and exercise, but there are other things that all men should do to help improve their overall health.

- Know your preventable risks
- Take steps to create healthful habits
- Schedule routine tests for early detection of disease
- Learn your risk factors—this includes knowing what your lab results are.
- Make sure your family physician knows your family health history.

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, the leading causes of death among men are heart disease, cancer, and accidental death.

Here are some steps you can take to begin to improve your health and decrease your risk factors:

- Make a commitment to have routine health checkups.
- If you've recently had a health checkup and you are at risk for heart disease, cancer or diabetes to name a few, consider making changes to your lifestyle to improve your health.
- Talk to your physician about the steps to take.
- Talk to the men in your life about making an appointment for a checkup.
- Take a walk with your father, brother, husband, son, friend or coworker.
- Cook up a healthy meal for the man or men in your life.

Without question men's health issues deserve attention and men must be encouraged to continue seeking health care. The responsibility lies with all of us to keep this conversation going, even once June is over—because men's health is always worthy of discussion. We can help by breaking down stigmas, encouraging and supporting men in our lives to seek care, and continue to ensure that no-one falls through the cracks.

# SEE LIGHT, BE LIGHT



In January 2021, National Youth Poet Laureate Amanda Gorman presented her poem "The Hill We Climb" at the presidential inauguration. The final lines read: "For there is always light, / if only we're brave enough to see it. / If only we're brave enough to be it."

How often we long for light! In recent years we've agonized amid pandemic, angry politics and new awareness of racism. Some have suffered deep sorrow. But Jesus says, "I am the light of the world" (John 8:12) and invites us to turn to him. God is always bringing light into darkness, through helpers, healers, peacemakers, friends. Sometimes bravery is required to turn our focus from the negative to the positive — to see the light of God.

Jesus also says, "*You* are the light of the world" (Matthew 5:14, emphasis added) and calls us to brighten the gloom. That requires bravery, as Gorman notes, but as Christians we're urged to look for light not just to make our own lives better but to shine into others' lives too. The Holy Spirit gives us the needed courage — to both *see* and *be* light.

The Women St. Paul's ELCA met on May 12 which was over a year since their last meeting due to the corona virus pandemic. It was great to meet once again and catch up with each other in person.

#### Convention

- We discussed the 31<sup>st</sup> annual convention to be held at Hope Lutheran Church in Tatamy on June 12<sup>th</sup>, either in person or online.
   Registration will be due by May 30 but voting delegates will need to be registered by May 15 and are required to attend the convention in person. Registration fees are \$20 if attending Hope Tatamy, which includes lunch; online registration fee is \$10.



# NORTHEASTERN PENNSYLVANIA SYNOD, ELCA

# Synod Assembly **2021** & MinLab

Our assembly is virtual to protect the most vulnerable around us, but we will be holding an in-person Ministry Laboratory (MinLab) on August 14, 2021. The MinLab will be held at the Lutheran Center. It's open to anyone, even people who were not voting members to the Synod Assembly. The Lab will allow participants to engage, in real time, with ministry ideas, congregations already participating in ministry projects, and allow space for participants to experiment with ideas, eat good food, and have fun!

Together we'll wonder about how we're healing the hurting, loving the land, and engaging the stranger!

# The Good News

June is here, and hope is busting out all over. We can worship outdoors, reducing greatly the still ongoing threat of the pandemic. The vaccines are effective and safe, and I urge everyone to get their doses, so we can move back indoors more safely this fall. Our synod just hosted its first event addressing racial issues, on May 22. Our online Synod Assembly June 4 and 5 is giving us new opportunities for "growing young and vital," as we share ministries that heal the hurt, love the land, and engage the stranger. And going forward from here, we are discovering how to partner more, as we are "gaining strength" and "going beyond death to life."

See the **boldface** type? Yes – I've just written a paragraph incorporating ALL the new vision and direction that we are exploring together! But more than just boldface words...what are we called to BOLDLY FACE – as ELCA, as synod, as congregations, and as baptized children of God?

The answer comes to us, simply and directly, from our scripture, both Old and New Testaments: St. Paul writes "For I am not ashamed of the gospel; it is the power of God for salvation to everyone who has faith..." (Romans 1:16). The prophet Micah declares: "[The lord] has told you, O mortal, what is good; and what does the lord require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God?" (Micah 6:8)

With these **bold directions**, how will we, the Northeastern

Pennsylvania Synod, proceed? HEALTHE HURTING: "[Jesus told them]: 'As you go, proclaim the good news, "The kingdom of heaven has come near." Cure the sick, raise the dead, cleanse the lepers, cast out demons.'" (Matthew 10:7)

LOVE THE LAND: "[The lord spoke to Moses]: The land shall not be sold in perpetuity, for the land is mine; with me you are but aliens and tenants. Throughout the land that you hold, you shall provide for the redemption of the land." (Leviticus 25:23-24)

ENGAGE THE STRANGER: "[The Son of Man will say when he comes in his glory]: 'Come, you that are blessed by my Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world; for I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me..." [Matthew 25:34-35]

These are just a few of the bold words, given to us by the God who created everything; who led the marginalized Hebrew people God loved out of slavery, through the wilderness, into the promised land; who came to us in the person of Jesus, healing the sick and raising the dead; who died for all for the forgiveness of all our sin; and who is raised from the dead and reigns forever, and will return to judge the living and the dead and live here forever with us in our resurrected creation.

This is a **bold promise**. We are called to **bold action**. And in this lovely month of June, one of those bold actions can be, that we love our LGBTQIA+ neighbors, who still feel like strangers in our midst. One bold action – simple, small, but significant – is my request to change our SYNOD NEWS banner, to reflect the BOLD RAINBOW COLORS of June Pride Month. I en-**courage** all of us to engage in more conversation and work together with our members and leaders who are Queer, to learn more and share more of the Good News and the good work of God, together. As Paul writes: **"For the whole law is summed up in a single commandment: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.'"** (Galatians 5:14)

Way back in 2001, the Northeastern Pennsylvania Synod at its Synod Assembly adopted a Continuing Resolution (#39) to make known its caring and concern for LGBTQIA+ people, their families and friends. Across our synod, congregations and organizations have themselves discerned and decided to join the RIC journey. "Reconciling in Christ" is a Lutheran movement led by the group RECONCILINGWORKS, whose vision is "to keep expanding the welcome, liberating those who are forced to live in the margins; to keep dismantling barriers and building bridges; and to keep working until all of God's beloved have equity."

An independent, Lutheran, membership-supported organization, RECONCILINGWORKS advocates for the acceptance and full participation of all sexual orientations, gender identities, and gender expressions within the Lutheran Church. 
