#### **PARISH NURSING NOTES**

"Pandemic Vocabulary" Peggy Saylor, RN

When I was doing my graduate work at Moravian College, one of my favorite courses was Epidemiology. However, I never in a million years thought that I would get to live through some of the terms that we discussed in class.

Yet here we are in the middle of a pandemic but hopefully headed toward a return to "normalcy" soon. Some of the terms have been confusing as well as how they relate to our present situation.

- 1. **Pandemic** this refers to an epidemic that has spread across multiple countries and has affected a large number of the population. When the World Health Organization classified the COVID-19 epidemic as a pandemic, more than 100 countries had reported cases and 118,000 individuals were affected.
- 2. **Epidemic** this term describes a disease where there is a sudden increase in cases above what is normally expected in a country or geographic area.
- 3. **Twindemic** some infectious disease experts are concerned that with the approach of winter when people spending less time in outdoor activities and more time huddled together in drier air, the influenza rate will be higher this year. If so and the COVID pandemic remains widespread a "twindemic" could occur. Hopefully, individuals will remain vigilant regarding social distancing and good handwashing hygiene. Wearing a mask in crowded area such as a bus, train or plane would also help. The largest deterrent to this scenario is vaccination for both influenza and COVID-19.
- 4. **Endemic** this refers to a disease that is still circulating but not out of control. Experts are predicting that sometime in the not-so-distance future such as a matter of months this will occur. Vaccines to boost the level of waning antibodies in a person's bloodstream will help prevent serious and even mild infections.

In summary, these are terms that most of us never expected to live through. As we enter the Advent season of hope, love, joy and peace, my holiday wish for all of you is that you experience these virtues with family and friends and enter the new year with good health and hopefully on the road to an endemic!

On behalf of the Food Bank, I would like to thank you for your food donation of 302 pounds of canned and boxed food given on 10/21/21. Your donation allows us to keep our shelves stocked with items that we know our clients appreciate. It also allows our budget for purchasing food to be stretched a little further.

Your support enables us to provide food assistance to 800+ low-income households in the Allentown area every month. Your donation helps us provide vital food resources throughout the year and especially during these critical months of the COVID-19 crisis. Last year alone the Food Bank served over 28,000 people. A recent Penn State University study reports 'over 12% of PA households were experiencing hunger at the end of 2020'

Our Food Bank serves over 24,000 people each year. Each visit provides our clients with enough groceries, including fresh fruits and vegetables, for a short period. It is with the generous donations, such as yours, that allow us to continue to serve those who are food insecure in our community.


#### A SHOOT BRINGS LIFE

Last year, Israeli scientists harvested dates from seeds that had been dormant about 2,000 years. The seeds, recovered during archaeological digs, were nurtured in incubators and several thrived. One (named Methuselah!) became a 10-foot-tall palm tree.

Horticulturists joked about marketing "dates that Jesus ate," but there's another scriptural connection. Isaiah 11, a traditional Advent reading, prophesies: "A shoot shall come out from the stump of Jesse, and a branch shall grow out of his roots" (verse 1, NRSV). Jesus is the tender shoot that emerged from the humble peasant origins of Jesse, father of King David. From a dynasty that went dormant due to Israel's sins sprouted a mighty tree, who will someday usher in a reign of peace (see verses 6-7).

Some people and churches celebrate Christmas with a Jesse Tree, remembering how God sent Jesus to sprout life out of death and bring new hope and joy to the world.



# What's up with the Synod Website!
