We raise our branches and shout "Hosanna!," then hear the Passion of Our Lord

Maundy Thursday – April 6th, 7:00pm

We receive individual absolution and Holy Communion and observe the stripping of the altar and the draping of it in black.

Good Friday - April 7th, 10:30am

Good Friday marks Jesus' trial, crucifixion, and death. Included in the service is the adoration of the cross.

The Resurrection of Our Lord – 9:00am(masked) and 10:30am

Christ is risen! He is risen indeed! Special music will be offered before the service.

HOLY HUMOR SUNDAY – APRIL 16th

Holy Humor Sunday, Day of Joy and Laughter, Bright Monday, White Monday, Emmaus Day, Dyngus Day, Risus Paschalis – these are all titles for a very old Christian tradition. The purpose of the day is to celebrate the resurrection in a joyful, humorous manner.

In the past 20 years an organization called "The Fellowship of Merry Christians" has revived this ancient custom and many churches today celebrate what many call "Holy Humor Sunday."

We will again celebrate Holy Humor Sunday here at St. Paul's on April 16th (the week after Easter, "low Sunday"). It is a day to make light of what we are about on a Sunday morning. Sometimes we get so hung up on the solemnity of worship and doing things "right" that we become rigid and think there is only one way to do things. It is one day out of the 52 Sundays that we worship when we can "not take ourselves so seriously." It is a day that we celebrate the joy of the resurrection, God defying the works of the devil. The devil thought he got rid of Jesus. The joke was on him. We have this great joy. We can celebrate, sing, laugh, and have fun.

Churches have done many different things on this day. People are asked to wear mismatched clothing, two different socks or shoes, or a tie that doesn't match. They play practical jokes on the pastor or the people, smiley faces on the paraments, do the liturgy in reverse order, the pastor changes the color of his stoles during the worship, and many other humorous things. Many people had a good time and enjoyed it immensely. Come and join in the fun.

PARISH NURSING NOTES

Spring is just around the corner. Physical activity (or anything that gets you moving) is really good for you. Even 5 minutes is a good start. Start easy and add as you feel stronger. Exercise helps control your blood pressure, lowers your bad cholesterol, boosts your mood and can also help improve your sleep quality. It helps keep your bones and joints strong and can also make your overall outlook more positive.

If you have a disability or other medical issues, you should talk to your physician to find satisfying and safe ways of accomplishing this. It's also a smart idea to get your Doctor's permission. If you have a heart condition, very cold or hot temperatures are hard on your heart. The suggestion can be to walk in an air conditioned or heated mall or only do so when the outside temperatures are more moderate. If you are overweight, getting more active can help stop you from gaining weight and lower your health risk as well.

The recommendation for exercise is 150 minutes of moderate intensity aerobic activity each week and 2 hours of muscle strengthening activity. (lifting weights, using resistance bands or pushups are a few ideas) Find things that you enjoy and exercise only to your tolerance. Even things like gardening, aerobic dusting, dancing or vacuuming could count:)

On behalf of the Food Bank, I would like to thank you for your food donation of 107 pounds of much needed items given on 3/14/23. Your donation allows us to keep our shelves stocked with items that we know our clients appreiate. It also allows our budget for purchasing food to be streched a little further.

Your support enables us to provide food assistance to 1,800+ low-income households in the Allentown area every month. Your donation helps us provide vital food resources throughout the year. Due to inflation, we have seen an increase in need, and the Food Bank has served over 47,000 people this year. A recent Penn State University study reports 'over 12% of PA households were experiencing hunger at the end of 2020'.

Please take note, that if you are admitted on a Thursday night, Friday, Saturday, or Sunday, the pastor will not be aware that you are hospitalized until Monday mid-morning, since the church does not have office hours on Friday, and the hospital pastoral care office is not available on Saturday or Sunday.

This means, if you would like the Pastor to know you are hospitalized on the weekend, please call the church office or the Pastor.



We have opened the church, and we will still be sending cards to the members of the congregation. If you know of someone who is ill or hospitalized, please let the office know. We will send a card signed from the congregation.





SHARING THE LOAD

In 1969 the Hollies released "He Ain't Heavy, He's My Brother." Do you know the story behind that song title?

Fifty years earlier in Omaha, Nebraska, a boy with polio was abandoned at Father Flanagan's Home for Boys, predecessor to the Boys Town organization. Soon several older residents started carrying young Howard — with his heavy leg braces — especially up stairs. Father Flanagan once saw an older boy, Reuben, doing this and asked if it was hard work. Reuben replied, "He ain't heavy, Father. He's my brother." Years later, these words and the image of one person carrying another became the Boys Town brand.

All of us have been "carried" at some point, and we've likely "carried" someone else. The Hollies' song declares: "His welfare is my concern." Jesus said it this way: "Love your neighbor as yourself." The load isn't too heavy to bear because Jesus himself is always carrying us.

Anyone having a plot on the cemetery is a shareholder. Officers are elected at this meeting.



OUR FAITH IN ACTION

Prince of Peace Lutheran Church in Bangor had the vision to extend the use of our outdoor grove for our community. When the pandemic hit in 2020, we found that our grove provided a new opportunity to worship together before we opened for indoor worship in late fall. Our vision took on a new reason: to make the grove more accessible and available for more use to complement worship.

The first step identified was building a walkway to make the grove easy to enter and exit. We applied for a grant from the Synod Witness and Service Team Ministry and received it. (We also applied for a special ELCA grant but did not receive the ELCA grant.) As buying supplies became an issue, we needed to apply for a second Witness and Service grant. We received this grant in June of 2022, which enabled us to complete the walkway for our 50th Anniversary picnic and joint worship with Christ Lutheran Church in Mt. Bethel.

Since the completion, we have held several outdoor worship services. We have also added "Faith by Firelight", a monthly gathering for anyone who wants to be in God's beautiful creation, play a few bible trivia games and enjoy s'mores. God has blessed our congregation with this beautiful space, and we keep visioning and planning for ways to make it a safe haven for our community and us. We are thankful that this grant was made possible through mission support given by congregations in our Synod.
