Dear Members and Friends,

We will celebrate Easter at the end of the month. Come worship with us through this Lenten season and be here to hear "He is risen! He is risen indeed!" That's the ancient greeting of the early Christians as they remembered and celebrated our Lords resurrection. We "celebrate Easter" one Sunday of the year but each Sunday is

really a celebration of the resurrection, a "little Easter" as Martin Luther said. Each Sunday we hear the Good News of God's transforming power to bring new life to each of us. We hear the Good News in the preached Word and in the words of Scripture and song. We have the resurrected presence of Christ in the elements of bread and wine. #### **PARISH NURSING NOTES**

"Type 2 Diabetes" March 2024 Peggy Saylor, RN

According to recent statistics by the CDC, 38 million people in the United States have diabetes, which is 1 in 10 people. Of those, 90-95% or approximately 21 million people have type 2 diabetes, and that number is increasing.

Just recently I was asked a puzzling question: If I have type 2 diabetes and get my blood sugars down to an acceptable value, why would I still be considered to have type 2 diabetes?

I must admit that it was a very good question that I did not know the answer to. After searching several websites, I uncovered the answer - Type 2 diabetes cannot be cured but it can be managed effectively with lifestyle changes, diet control and medication if needed. Glucose levels can return to non-diabetic levels, but the underlying cause cannot be reversed.

The cause of type 2 diabetes is the result of two problems:

- 1. Cells in muscle, fat and the liver become resistant to insulin (which the pancreas secretes) causing the cells to not take in enough sugar.
- 2. The pancreas cannot make enough insulin to keep blood sugar levels within a healthy range.

The good news is that type 2 diabetes can be managed through different treatments. If you are overweight, shedding pounds to get your weight under control can have dramatic results. Increasing your physical activity and changing your diet can contribute to lowering your glucose levels as well. At times, medication may be needed as well.

Mayo Clinic has a wonderful website that offers an overview on type 2 diabetes and diet control that can be accessed at <u>https://www.mayoclinic.org/disease-conditions/type-2-diabetes</u>. Area health care systems have excellent education programs on using a diabetic

diet and can be accessed through your primary care provider. Of course, the best method is prevention before it occurs. The Mayo Clinic offers the following suggestions for lifestyle choices to help prevent type 2 diabetes:

- Eat healthy foods. Choose foods lower in fat and calories and higher in fiber. Focus on fresh fruits, vegetables and whole grains.
- Get active. If possible, aim for 150 or more minutes a week of moderate to vigorous aerobic activity, such as a brisk walk, bicycling, running, or swimming.
- Losing weight. If you are overweight, losing a modest amount of weight can help. If you are pre-diabetic, losing 7-10% of your body weight may reduce the risk of diabetes.



#### **RESURRECTION RUMBLINGS**

In *Easter Earthquake*, James A. Harnish explores the "earthshaking promise" of Jesus' resurrection. Easter Sunday "shatters the power of fear," he writes. "Because Christ is risen, we no longer allow fear to dominate, control or manipulate us. We don't remain imprisoned in the tombs of our past failures or buried under the weight of present anxiety. In the risen Christ, old things pass away and everything becomes new."

Easter, Harnish adds, is proof that God hasn't forsaken us and is present among us. "The Resurrection contradicts the assumption that Christ resides on an ethereal cloud in a distant heaven. Rather, we find him on the dusty road that leads to the real stuff of our ordinary world."

Jesus' followers can find him everywhere, Harnish concludes. "The risen Christ will meet us along the confused, chaotic, fearful paths of our lives and speak the same words the women hear at the tomb, 'Do not be afraid."

# Cultivating Generosity


Throughout the fall our congregations are often focused on stewardship and gratitude for the generosity of members. Folks provide stewardship talks, members complete commitment cards, and sermons are proclaimed to encourage generosity of time, talent and finances. But did you know that our ELCA Congregation and Synod Support Team offers training and recommendations on cultivating generosity?

This past fall, in partnership with the Lake Institute on Faith and Giving, stewardship leaders from eight congregations, representing four ELCA synods, came together for a training series called "Cultivating Generous Congregations" (CGC). Over seven weeks leaders from these eight congregations gathered online as a cohort with the Lake Institute's trained faculty and each other. Cultivating Generous Congregations maps the new landscape of religious giving and provides congregational teams with tools to build a culture of generosity unique to each congregation's needs, challenges, and opportunities. CGC explores theology, the role of adaptive leadership, fiscal transparency, and the importance of giver care, with action steps to impact the exploration of generosity and energize congregational generosity to take the significant and necessary steps to creating lasting cultural change.

Following the final session, the eight congregations received a year of access to the Lake Institute's numerous stewardship resources, as well as optional coaching to assist in the implementation of these practices. Mission Support funds the opportunity for congregations and leaders to learn from stewardship experts and one another and to grow together so that their local mission, and how God is growing generosity, can be told in more effective ways in today's culture.

## A Carpenter on the Cross

Dear Lehigh Mission District,

"Isn't this the carpenter?" Mark 6:3 NIV

Jesus would have worked right alongside his father Joseph. Jesus would have been familiar with his father's carpentry trade. He would have known about the mallets, saws, nails, axes, chisels, squares, and rule sticks that form part of a carpenter's tools.

As a carpenter's son Jesus understood the building process - beams, gates, doors, windows, roofs, and cornerstones. In public Jesus would have easily been identified as a carpenter. The question, "Isn't this the carpenter?" formed part of his identity.

It's ironic that this carpenter would be sentenced to death by crucifixion under the Roman government because the carpentry tools Jesus grew up knowing were being used to crucify him.

Crucifixion was the capital punishment used by the Roman government for execution. Jesus witnessed the mallets, nails, beam, and was then lifted on a wooden cross.

Jesus died because he was building a better world for humanity. A world Jesus called the kingdom of God.


